Engine & Powertrain

Engine Condition: Inspected Caterpillar diesel engine (355 HP). Engine started smoothly with no unusual noises or excessive smoke.

Oil Levels: Engine oil level checked and found to be within recommended range. No signs of leaks detected.

Air Intake System: Air filter clean and free of blockages. No restrictions noted in the intake system.
